



Total Grant Amount: € 82,409.60 Total Beneficiaries: 1,013 Children and 80 Women

The UNWG raises all of the charity funds through members' activities, the Bazaar and major donors. The Annual International Charity Bazaar contributes the most to the fund. The projects funded address the basic needs of children all around the world. There were 90 project proposals submitted from 26 countries. Ten projects from nine countries in four different regions of the world were approved for funding in 2025.

Objective: The primary goal of this project is to establish quality early childhood education program that will serve this community, ensuring that all children in this community have access to the resources and support they need to succeed.

At Naisinyai village, a village mostly occupied by Maasai tribe a pastoralist tribe, recent reports indicate that education provision among the pastoralists is still problematic due to contextual issues such as poverty, students' mobility, remoteness of the areas, inadequate facilities, scattered populations, and harsh environmental conditions in their areas.

Specific need: Equipping, furnishing and decorating a nursery school classroom

Objective: To equip their education centre with solar panels and IT equipment such as PCs, projectors and a printer. The solar panel installation will diminish the centre's electricity costs, allowing more funds to be available for the schooling of the children.

The basic IT equipment will mainly serve the after-school programs, which was created to assist and further equip students sponsored by the organisation. These students, living in the slum, do not have the possibility to access the Internet and do their homework and research for their studies without such equipment.

Objective: The project aims to create a dedicated space within the National Institute of Pediatrics designed to provide comprehensive support to families of children with serious illnesses. Through these services, the centre aims to reduce stress, anxiety, and depression, enhance coping mechanisms, and foster a sense of hope and resilience.

They will provide psychosocial support and occupational therapy space for children with serious, often, incurable diseases and their parents will allow for individual and group consultations, preparation for certain types of medical procedures, and providing psychological support after their completion as well as providing consultative-rehabilitation assistance, working with certain symptoms that can be corrected, such as developing non-verbal communication, reducing anxiety, spasticity, etc.

Specific need: Sensory therapy equipment and furniture for the centre

Objective/s: The project aims to install solar panels on the roof of two buildings of the center to cover electricity for both buildings, to provide sustainable energy source for continuous electricity, reduce electricity costs for the center, which operates year-round.

1. Reduce electricity costs;

2. Ensure sustainable and independent energy supply to support the center's year-round operations;

 Allocate all savings from electricity costs to the center's development, including small renovations, purchasing necessary items for the classroom's smooth development to ensure sustainable operations.

The bicycle will allow a wheelchair to be carried. This will be used in the family therapy plans, allowing parents and their wheelchair bound child to experience nature and excursion together.
