

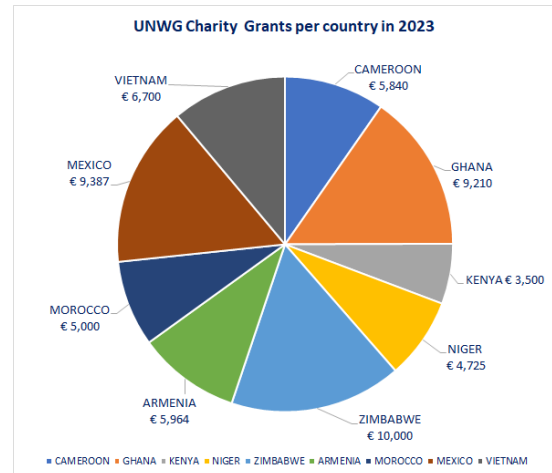


UNWG Children Charity Projects Approved for 2023

Total grant amount: €60,326

Total beneficiaries: 1,539 children and 52 women

The UNWG raises all the charity funds through members' activities and the Bazaar. The Annual International Charity Bazaar contributes the most to the fund. COVID 19 interrupted the years 2020-2022 and significantly depleted UNWG's charity funds. The total grant of 2023 reflects the difficult situation worldwide due to the pandemic.



Africa

Total UNWG grant: €33,275

Total number of beneficiaries: 1,359 children and 10 women

Cameroon

Organization: Help for Orphans in Cameroon

Project Site: Bwitingi, Buea, Cameroon

Objective: Furniture and equipment for community-based rehabilitation center for migrant children

This is a comprehensive community-based rehabilitation project for war children that will reduce morbidity and mortality of children thereby improving physical and mental health, as well as school attendance and good academic performance. The total cost of the project is €11,260 and will be implemented by Help for Orphans in Cameroon in partnership with the Ministry of Public Health, as well as Belie Health Foundation and Mother Care Foundation. The UNWG funding will be used to provide equipment and furniture at the nutrition rehabilitation and education center to enhance theory and practical lessons for caregivers and other migrants.

Ghana

Organization: Perfect Relief Foundation International

Project Site: Accra, Bosomabena, central region of Ghana

Objective: Safety within and out for Disabled Children and Orphans (Shelter Renovation)

The organization's main goal is to bring mental rest amongst the disadvantaged orphaned children and widows, whereby the availability of adequate shelter plays an essential role in overcoming vulnerability and building resilience. This project seeks to secure funds to renovate a spacious 2-story shelter to accommodate 40 orphaned children and 10 widows. The organization's headquarters is based in the same area where the shelter will be renovated. They are looking at several ways of

maintaining the shelter for continuity and sustenance. The UNWG will partially fund this program, paying for construction material, paint, ceiling fans, and bathroom renovation materials. The UNWG will not pay for the transport of wood but will take over the renovation of the bathrooms instead.

Kenya

Organization: KULE Foundation

Project Site: Munkangu Secondary School, Munkangu village, Murang county

Objective: Latrine Proposal for Munkangu Secondary School

Currently the school is facing a serious problem of not having enough toilet facilities for students. Consequently, to address this problem there is an urgent need to build a block of ten cubicle latrines, five on each side, plus a urinal for the boys. Each cubicle will have a tap outside for washing hands as flush latrines would be too expensive to maintain due to the water shortage in the area. The VIC 1% Fund is in partnership with the UNWG in this project. The UNWG will contribute towards the cost of materials.

Niger

Organization: Don De Soi-Gudunmuwa

Project Site: Kobontafa Primary School, Niamey, Niger

Objective: Education and vocational training support project

This is a new organization that was established in 2021. The Kobontafa Primary School is in a peripheral district of Niamey (Commune # 4) in the southeastern part of Niger, Tillaberi. The organization's goal is to support and provide begging children with opportunities for education, better health, basic services and to clean up Niger cities through sanitation activities. Currently they are working with schools at the primary level as well as 2 training centers for vocational training. The UNWG will partially fund the Kobontafa primary school section by providing 100 desks and benches.

Zimbabwe

Organization: Mkauzaneni Primary School

Project Site: Siyabalandela village, Tsholotsho district, Matabeleland North province, Zimbabwe

Objective: Mkauzaneni Primary school renovation project

The school aims at providing high quality and relevant primary education. Funds are requested for the renovation of 4 classrooms which includes re-roofing, removal of the floors, repair of cracked walls, replacement of broken window frames, furniture, bookshelves, etc. This project will significantly improve the community's well-being through strengthening the educational infrastructure and consequently the academic status of the children and illiterate adults in the area.

Vietnam

Organization: SAO BIEN - Room for Education

Project Site: Khe Nap village, Bao Nam commune, Ky Son district, Nghe An province, Vietnam

Objective: Education support in Khe Nap Village – New School, Bright Future

This project will build a new kindergarten in one of the most remote villages in Vietnam. The village is mostly populated by the Kho Mu ethnic minority group who live on subsistence farming. The current school is in poor condition, which is a danger to the children during bad weather conditions. The new school will be built with sustainable materials and be designed particularly for children. The building will have a classroom and an outside protected area.

NUMBER OF CHILDREN: 23 boys and 27 girls, aged 3 to 5 years old.

GRANT AMOUNT: €6,700

Armenia

Organization: "Astghavard" Disabled Children's Parents NGO

Project Site: Vardenis town, Gegharkunik region, Armenia

Objective: Safe Haven and Special Behaviour Treatments for War Stricken Refugees (mainly mothers and children)

This project plans to equip and furnish a room in the building belonging to the NGO for rehabilitation, psychological support, logopedic services, and lessons for disabled children and children who have been displaced due to conflict. The grant will purchase furniture, floor mats, development games and therapy supplies. The project will allow the NGO to provide therapy that will help the children have a brighter future.

Mexico

Organization: Fundación Ramón Vargas, A.C.

Project Site: Village of Santa María Quiegolani, Oaxaca, Mexico

Objective: Rehabilitation of a dormitory building for a boarding school for girls and young ladies
This project will repair the girls' dormitory at a school that caters to children with disabilities and those living in remote, rural locations with no access to a school. The current roof leaks and this has caused problems with the electrical fixtures. The grant will be used to replace the roof, rewire the dormitory with new plugs and light fixtures, and paint. This will allow a safe living space for the girls which will allow them to receive an education.

NUMBER OF CHILDREN: 35 girls and 12 women per year

GRANT AMOUNT: €9,387

Middle East & North Africa

Total UNWG grant: €5,000

Total number of beneficiaries: 40 children

Morocco

Organization: Louis Braille Association for the Blind Children.

Project Site: The project will take place in the north central Moroccan city of Tetouan.

Objective: Inclusive Education for Children with Visual Impairment

The association is well established and is implementing activities in public schools for the blind students. The materials chosen for the project will help educate 40 children and allow the children to be integrated and inclusive in regular public schools. The book readers Technological given for this project is a 3 in 1 electronic braille device that serves as a self-contained note taker, braille display and book reader. The UNWG will fund 3 Orbit Readers 20, and 47 canes.

SECTOR: Education/Special Needs

NUMBER OF CHILDREN: 20 boys and 20 girls (aged 7 to 18 years old)

GRANT AMOUNT: €5,000
