



Charity Projects Selected for Funding in 2024

Total Grant Amount: €79,409

Total Beneficiaries: 3,843 children and 350 women

The UNWG raises all of the charity funds through members' activities, the Bazaar and major donors. The Annual International Charity Bazaar contributes the most to the fund. The projects funded address the basic needs of children all around the world. There were 11 projects from 11 countries and at least one project from each region of the world approved for funding in 2024.



AFRICA

Cape Verde

Organization: Delta Cultura Project Site: Tarrafal, Cape Verde

Objective: Delta Cultura provides a safe place for the children of Tarrafal Cape Verde with sports, educational, cultural, and artist programs. This project will provide new tables and chairs for the education program to allow them to extend their school support program with tutoring and homework support.

Democratic Republic of Congo

Organization: Association des Techniciens en Action pour le Développement Communautaire

Project Site: Wamuzimu, Kitutu, Mwenga, Democratic Republic of Congo

Objective: The Baraka Medical Center provides pediatric and maternity care to the residents of the Kitutu Health zone that has a population of 400,000. There are 7-12 babies delivered and over 50 children seen every day. The center currently lacks electricity and hospital beds are in need of replacement. Unfortunately women and children have died during the night due to the lack of electricity. This project will provide a solar energy kit and 75 new beds and mattresses for the Baraka Medical Center.

Ghana

Organization: Vulnerable Aid Organization

Project Site: Nkwanta south municipality, Oti region, Ghana

Objective: The Laboano primary school currently does not have a safe latrine for the children and staff to use, leading to a drop in enrollment and increased incidence of communicable diseases such as typhoid, cholera and diarrhea from a variety of gastrointestinal pathogens and parasites. Vulnerable Aid Organization will construct a sustainable six-sitter ventilated improved pit toilet at the school to improve hygiene of students, increase enrollment and also improve hygiene education.

Kenya

Organization: Migosi Family Hope Austria (Verein zur Förderung von Schulkindern in Kenia)

Project Site: Kisumu, Kenya

Objective: The Migosi Family Hope Society runs "Seeds of Hope" school in Kisumu, Kenya. They have recently constructed a library at the school that will be open for both the students of the school and the

community. This grant will be used to purchase 2,000 books for the library.

Nigeria

Organization: Okaja Foundation, Divine Providence Home

Project Site: Monoiya, Ogoja, Nigeria

Objective: The Divine Providence Home is one of the only orphanages in the city. Unfortunately many children are living on the streets due to extreme poverty and some have been left parentless due to the AIDS crisis. The Divine Providence Home takes children from the streets and orphans and gives them a place to live. Some of the children are adopted, but some stay at the home. The current building has reached capacity and the Okaja Foundation has been able to construct an additional facility to allow the home to take in up to 50 additional orphaned and abandoned children in need of shelter. The grant will purchase beds, mattresses and cupboards to furnish the new facility.

Cambodia

Organization: Cambodian Agency Development of Disability and the Poor

Project Site: Damnak Ampil, Dang Tong, Kampot, Cambodia

Objective: This project will construct a two room building at the Damnak Ampil Primary School. One room will be used for a special education classroom to provide children with autism and other disabilities with a classroom with specialized teachers to allow for improved educational experiences. The other room will be used as a school library that all children at the school can benefit from.

Austria

Organization: Kleine Herzen Project Site: Neudauberg, Austria

Objective: Kleine Herzen assisted in the evacuation of an orphanage from the Kirovograd of Ukraine to Austria. Currently, 53 children are housed at the orphanage in Austria, 20 of the children are disabled, 5 of which are severely disabled. The grant will be used to buy specialty hospital beds to provide comfort and

support needed for the severly disabled children.

Poland

Organization: Stowarzyszenie na Rzecz Dzieci z Chorobami Krwi w Lublinie (Association for Children with

Blood Diseases in Lublin)
Project Site: Lublin, Poland

Objective: The Department of Paediatric Haematology, Oncology and Transplantology at Medical University of Lublin serves children with blood diseases (hemophilia, hemorrhagic diathesis, anemias) and neoplastic diseases (all types of pediatric cancers) from the entire Lublin macroregion. The hospital ward was recently renovated, but there were no funds to replace the furniture. This project aims to purchase new furniture for the patients' rooms in order to help the children feel a little more like they were in their own home and own room. It is important because children and their parents often spend long weeks or months in the hospital and the project aims to create a new friendly environment for the children to escape the negativity of their treatment. The grant will be used to buy beds, bedside tables and cabinets for 3 hospital rooms.

Argentina

Organization: Asociación Civil Diversamente Posibles Project Site: Costa del Este, Buenos Aires, Argentina

Objective: The organization Asociación Civil Diversamente Posibles aims to create opportunities for all people to have access to sports despite disabilities. The project will recycle, rehabilitate and adapt 30 bicycles specifically designed for adapted use by children with disabilities. The organization will also organize a bicycle rally race for adaptive bicycle users. The grant will also be used to construct 20 chairs that will be used for surfing experiences and a surfing competition. The same chairs will be reused during a running race that is specifically designed for children and teenagers with disabilities. The sporting events will be integrated for children and teenagers with and without disabilities to allow for more inclusion.

Bolivia

Organization: Hogar de Niños Alalay

Project Site: Santa Rita, Santa Cruz de la Sierra, Bolivia

Objective: Hogar de Niños Alalay provides housing, food, health and education for children and adolescents living on the streets. The organization adheres a therapeutic model including social, educational and psychological development programs. Since the pandemic, the situation of families in vulnerable situations has deteriorated enormously, which has also led to an increase in the number of children living on the streets. ALALAY responded to this situation and obtained government approval for the new admission of children. To provide housing for these new children, the grant will be used to purchase beds, mattresses and cupboards.

Tunisia

Project Site: Gabes, Tunisia

Objective: This project aims to improve the scholar environment of visually impaired pupils in the Higher school for visually impaired pupils Jalouli Fares. The project will purchase educational tools of slates and stylets for braille writing, a printer for braille printing, and geographic maps designed for visually impaired students. Additionally the project will purchase and install a water tank for the dormitory to provide the boarding students with access to water during water cuts.
